Angela Simone lived in Milan from 1983 where she attended the graphics course c/o the European Institute of Design. She worked in Milan as a graphic journalist c/o the editorial staff of 'Glamour' and 'ELLE Italia'. Although technology has taken over in his work, she has never forgotten her great love: paper. **Comieco** since its inception has encouraged her in the production of jewelry she made using corrugated cardboard, recycled and worked with the 'quilling' technique. Her works, as well as published by the main fashion magazines and worn in fashion services, have been presented in numerous exhibitions, among the main ones in 2004 she presents her first collection at the Fabriano Boutique in Milan (IT); in 2007 she took part in the 'Cartasia' Biennale in Lucca (IT); in 2008 at the 'Cloudnine' Pitti Immagine in Milan (IT); 2009 sees her as the protagonist of the personal exhibition organized by the **Department of Culture of the Municipality** of **Vicenza** (IT) and participates in the 'Paper Jewels' exhibition at the Milan **Triennale (IT)**. In **2010** she will participate in the 'Grassimesse' exhibition c/o Grassi Museum in Leipzig (D); in 2012/13 at the Joya Contemporary Jewelery Fair in Barcelona (E); in 2012 at the Amateras International Annual Paper Art Exibition, Sofia; in **2012** at 'Eunique' in **Karlsruhe (D)**; in **2015** at the 'Jewel of Taste' exhibition in Palazzo Morando, Milan (IT). In 2018 she received the award ceremony for 'Artistar' Palazzo Giureconsulti in Milan (IT) to participate in 'Sieraad artfair jewelery', Amsterdam (NL). In January 2019 some of his works are selected to be exhibited for two years in the 'Beauty Room' of the Jewelery Museum in Vicenza (IT). In next 4 february 2021 she's selected from AdOC for the V Exposition Contemporary Jewels in Madrid (E). She exhibits in concept stores, art galleries, showrooms and collaborates with fashion designers. She offers workshops and workshops on request.

"I graduate as a graphic designer at the European Institute of Design in Milan. What has always fascinated me is paper, craftsmanship, creativity. Paper is the material that I love the most and that most represents me, apparently fragile but actually very resistant, it does not forget its primary structure, wood. It is so light that can fly but at the same time can also be solid and compact. Only since 2003 I have discovered the pleasure of using it, precious or recycled, to make 'jewels'. I love paper, its scent, its texture. Being accustomed to design, composition, harmony of colours and shapes, it was natural to move from the two-dimensional sheet to the three-dimensionality of objects. Rolling up triangles and rectangles with glue and papers of different weights and weights, give me the possibility to invent resistant pearls, impermeable to water and always surprising: wide or narrow, large or small, pot-bellied or dry, baroque or minimalist. I use all sorts of paper but I favour recycled paper and corrugated cardboard for its plasticity. Then, I choose threads and yarns to tie them together, without limits of imagination, a new piece is born and every time it is a surprise. I like to experiment with new materials because I, for one, am curious to know what the future pearls will be like. Each card gives me different feelings and inspirations when I listen deeply. Each 'jewel' is made entirely by hand with materials and light equipment that allows me to work anywhere. I am convinced that the artisan dimension lies in the middle, between the mind and the heart. Like any other hand-worked paper, paper brings with it the moods and emotions of the people who have touched them or just touched them, of the places they have been. For several years I have been offering seminars or short workshops, to convey what I have learned so far on paper: sharing is the most important thing in every human relationship, giving and taking in a continuous exchange.









The 'quilling' technique allows creating beads of paper very different from each other in form, shape and colour; therefore it offers endless solutions for the manufacture of the jewels themselves. Apposite glue will penetrate into the paper to make it one, solid and impermeable item. Working with fine strips of rice paper, it is possible to create miniscule beads as hard as rock; while rolling up a thin, corrugated cardboard produces big, thick and ragged beads, yet very light. Silk, cotton, wool and other fibres hold the beads together, creating unique necklaces all the time. Other elements that suit the type of paper used can be inserted too: glass beads, ceramics, wood and so on. In like manner, there can be metal clasps or covered and/or decorated cardboard.
